Employment Exchanges, Skill Development and Labour Offices — NCT of Delhi

Overview of Delhi's Manpower Infrastructure

The National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi houses one of India's most comprehensive networks of manpower and employment-related offices. These offices serve as the primary interface between job seekers and employers, facilitating placement services, vocational training, labour law enforcement, and skill development initiatives across all districts of Delhi. The network encompasses Employment Exchanges, District Employment Offices, Skill Development Centres, Labour Offices, and Apprenticeship Facilitation Centres.

Delhi's manpower office infrastructure is administered by multiple government departments including the Department of Employment (DoE), the Delhi Skill and Entrepreneurship University (DSEU), the Labour Department, the Directorate of Training and Technical Education (DTTE), and various central government bodies. Together, these agencies work to bridge the gap between the supply and demand of skilled labour in the capital.

District Employment Offices — Complete List

Delhi is divided into eleven revenue districts, each of which is served by at least one District Employment Office. These offices maintain a live register of job seekers, conduct counselling sessions, organise job fairs, and liaise with employers for on-campus and off-campus recruitment drives. Central Employment Exchange, New Delhi

The Central Employment Exchange (CEE), located at Shram Shakti Bhawan, Rafi Marg, New Delhi, is the apex employment facilitation office under the Directorate General of Employment, Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India. It caters specifically to the placement needs of central government departments, public sector undertakings, and autonomous bodies at the national level. The CEE maintains a separate register for technical and non-technical job seekers and regularly notifies vacancies from major central government employers.

The CEE operates from Monday to Friday between 9:30 AM and 6:00 PM. Walk-in registration is available for candidates with a valid educational qualification certificate and identity proof.

Additionally, the CEE conducts periodic employer-meet programmes where representatives from PSUs and government departments visit the exchange to shortlist registered candidates.

University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau

The UEIGB is a specialised employment office that operates within or in coordination with universities and colleges across Delhi. Its primary mandate is to assist final-year students and recent graduates in identifying employment opportunities, preparing for job interviews, and gaining access to career counselling. The bureau works closely with the Department of Employment to ensure that students are aware of the various placement schemes and skill development programmes available to them.

Labour Offices in Delhi

The Labour Department of the Government of NCT of Delhi operates multiple offices across the city to enforce labour laws, settle industrial disputes, and protect the rights of workers in both the organised and unorganised sectors. These offices function under the Labour Commissioner and play a vital role in maintaining harmonious industrial relations within the capital.

Skill Development Centres in Delhi

Delhi Skill and Entrepreneurship University (DSEU), established under the Delhi Skill and Entrepreneurship University Act 2020, is the nodal agency for skill development in the NCT. DSEU operates multiple campuses across Delhi offering diploma and degree-level programmes in automotive, electronics, healthcare, hospitality, retail, and information technology sectors.

In addition to DSEU, the Directorate of Training and Technical Education (DTTE) oversees a network of Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) that provide vocational training in over forty trades. These ITIs are located in every district of Delhi, ensuring that skill development opportunities are accessible to residents across the city.

Job Fairs and Placement Drives

Delhi's manpower offices regularly organise Mega Job Fairs, Rojgar Melas, and targeted placement drives to connect employers with job seekers in an efficient and structured manner. These events are typically held at district-level venues such as community halls, school grounds, and public parks to maximise accessibility for all sections of society.

The Department of Employment, in collaboration with the National Career Service (NCS) Portal managed by the Ministry of Labour and Employment, maintains a digital database of registered job seekers and employers. Candidates can register on the NCS Portal at www.ncs.gov.in to access real-time job listings, apply for vacancies online, and receive SMS alerts for upcoming job fairs in their area.

Self-Employment and Entrepreneurship Support

Beyond wage employment, Delhi's manpower offices also facilitate access to self-employment and entrepreneurship schemes. The Delhi government's Rozgar Bazaar portal and the Mukhyamantri Yuva Udyami Yojana provide aspiring entrepreneurs with financial assistance, mentoring, and market linkage support. Manpower offices serve as dissemination points for information about these schemes and help eligible candidates complete application formalities.

Apprenticeship and Industrial Training

The Apprenticeship Facilitation Centres operating under the DTTE and the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) administered by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship play a crucial role in creating industry-ready talent. Companies operating in Delhi are required under the Apprentices Act 1961 to engage apprentices in designated trades in proportion to the size of their workforce.

The Regional Apprenticeship Training Centre (RATC) located at Okhla, New Delhi, is the primary office responsible for supervising apprenticeship engagement in the Delhi-NCR region. The RATC maintains a record of all apprentices engaged by establishments in Delhi and conducts trade tests at the end of the apprenticeship period to certify the skills acquired by the trainees.

Special Cells for Vulnerable Groups

Delhi's employment offices operate special cells for Persons with Disabilities (PwD), Ex-Servicemen, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates, and women returnees to the workforce. These cells provide dedicated counselling, reservation-based placement assistance, and information about targeted government schemes such as the National Action Plan for Skill Training of Persons with Disabilities.

Unorganised Sector Workers' Welfare

A significant portion of Delhi's workforce is employed in the unorganised sector, including construction, domestic work, street vending, rickshaw pulling, and small-scale manufacturing. To address the welfare needs of this workforce, the Delhi government has established the Construction Workers' Welfare Board, the Delhi Shops and Establishments Act Cell, and the Unorganised Workers' Social Security Cell.

These bodies work in conjunction with Labour Offices across the city to register unorganised workers, issue identity cards, and extend social security benefits such as accident insurance, health coverage, and educational scholarships for workers' children. Registration can be completed at any of the Labour Offices listed in this document.

Inter-State Migrant Workers Cell

Delhi, as a major destination for migrant workers from states such as Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Jharkhand, and West Bengal, has a dedicated Inter-State Migrant Workers Cell under the Labour Department. This cell enforces the provisions of the Inter-State Migrant Workmen (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act 1979, ensuring that migrant workers are paid fair wages, provided adequate living conditions, and not subjected to exploitation by contractors or middlemen.

How to Register at Delhi Employment Offices

Registering at a Delhi Employment Exchange or District Employment Office is a straightforward process. Job seekers are required to visit their nearest District Employment Office with originals and photocopies of their educational qualification certificates, date of birth proof, identity proof (Aadhaar Card, Voter ID, or Passport), and two passport-size photographs. Upon submission of the registration form, the candidate is allotted a unique Employment Registration Number.

Renewal of the Employment Registration is mandatory and must be completed every three years. Failure to renew results in removal of the candidate from the live register. Renewal can be done either by visiting the respective office in person or through the NCS Portal online.

Candidates who register online receive notifications about job openings that match their educational qualifications and skill profile.

Looking ahead, the Delhi government has announced plans to further strengthen this network by digitising more services, expanding the reach of skill development programmes to underserved areas, and increasing coordination between employment offices and private sector employers. The integration of data analytics into job-matching processes is also being explored to improve placement outcomes for registered job seekers.

Citizens are encouraged to visit their nearest District Employment Office or access services through the NCS Portal and the Delhi government's e-district portal to take full advantage of the employment facilitation and social security services available to them. For grievances and complaints, a dedicated helpline and online grievance redressal mechanism is available through the Labour Department's official website.
